Re-establishment of rights (Art. 122 EPC)
The applicant who, in spite of all due care required by the circumstances having been taken, was unable to comply with the requirements under Article 121 and Rule 135 EPC within the two-month time limit(s) for requesting further processing, shall have his rights re-established upon request, provided that the time limits and other requirements of Rule 136(1) and (2) EPC are met.

Re-establishment has to be requested and a fee for re-establishment has to be paid in respect of each of the unobserved time limits, for example in respect of each time limit for requesting further processing missed (see Guidelines for examination in the EPO, E-VIII, 3.1.3).

Request under Article 7(3) and (4) Rules relating to Fees
