

EUROPEAN PATENT ADMINISTRATION CERTIFICATION (EPAC)

What is EPAC?

EPAC is designed for professionals seeking to validate their patent administration knowledge and skills.

It offers a flexible and modular certification path with four online exams that each earn an official EPO diploma when passed.

Once all four modules have been successfully completed, the candidate is awarded an EPAC certificate.

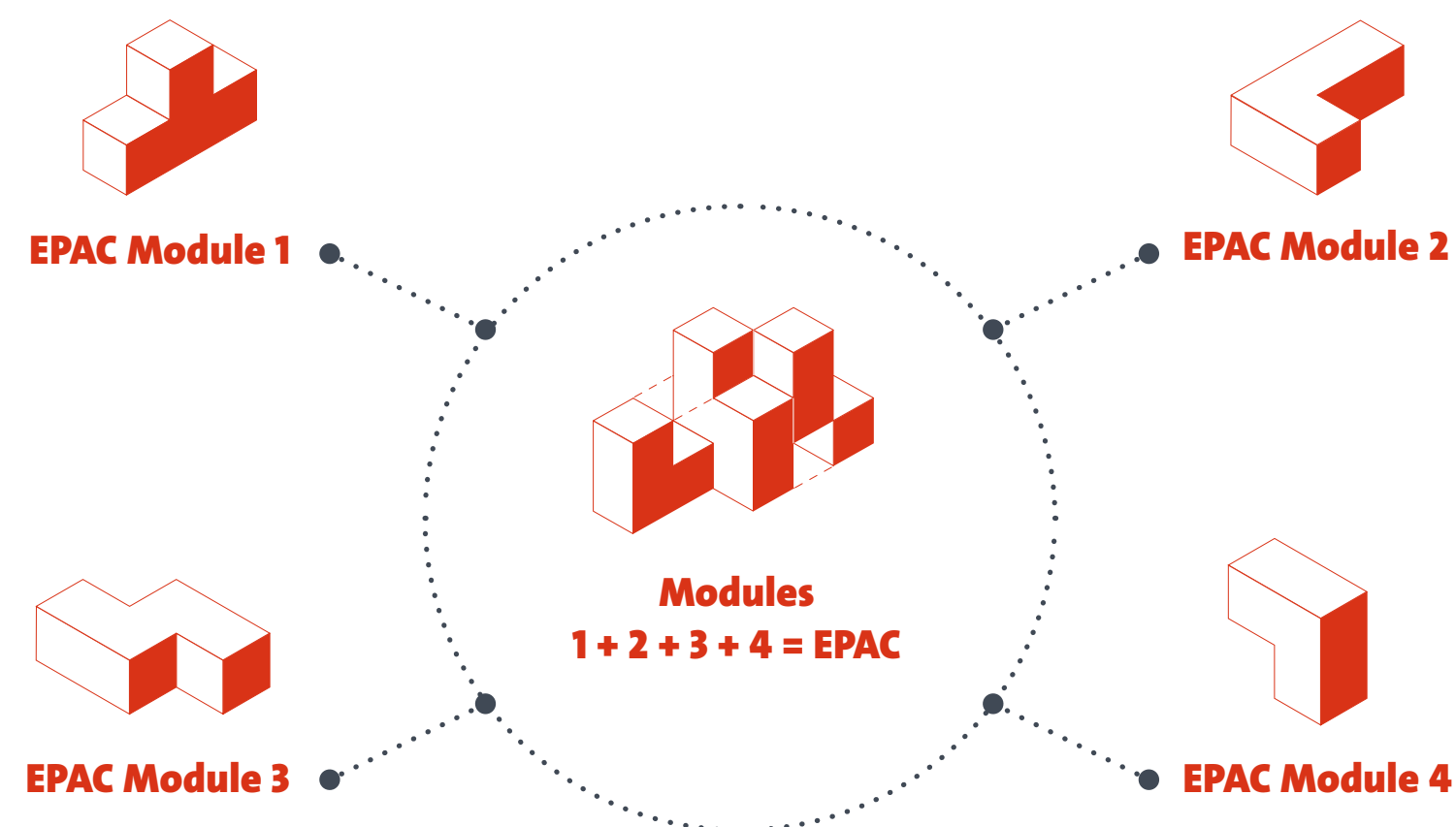
Who is EPAC relevant for?

- Early-career professionals looking to build a foundation in patent administration.
- Experienced patent administrators and paralegals aiming to formalise and expand their expertise.
- Staff in patent offices and intellectual property departments.
- IP specialists and innovation stakeholders in industry, private practice and academia.

There are no restrictions regarding education, residence, or professional experience.

EPAC Modules

- **EPAC Module 1:** Patent law: EPC and PCT
Diploma in patent administration under European and international patent law.
Recommended starting point – foundational module.
- **EPAC Module 2:** EPO procedures in filing, search and examination.
Diploma in patent grant procedure.
- **EPAC Module 3:** EPO post-grant procedures: appeals, validation and Unitary Patent.
Diploma in post-grant procedures.
- **EPAC Module 4:** PCT procedure and entry into national/regional phases.
Diploma in PCT procedure.
