

TOPIC 2 – Improvement in OPD System

- OPD System should be referred to as the Global Dossier (GD) system to avoid confusion
- Further attention to existing system
 - Timeliness is still an issue
 - There is still missing information
 - Possibility of having documentary data available in text format
 - Enhanced citations needs further attention
 - OPD-API should be made open to the public



TOPIC 2 – Improvement in OPD System

- Suggested improvements
 - Maintenance/Legal status should be included or linked within the GD
 - NPL documents should be included
 - More granularity in citation of references. More labels should be used to identify documents
 - Add appeals and trial decisions
 - Use GD for automatic exchange of priority documents
 - Maintenance periods of the IP5 databases could be harmonized



TOPIC 3 – Updates on GD Priorities

- XML'ization
 - Industry believes this is the most important issue
 - IP5 should give priority to this issue so faster progress can be made
 - Users should not be penalized for XML'ization issues that are outside of their control
 - Once XML'ization is achieved, coordination is necessary to permit access to utilize common search techniques, common APIs, common esignatures in a coordinated and uniform manner
 - DOCX filings proposed by USPTO should not be a mandatory or increase users' burdens



TOPIC 3 – Updates on GD Priorities

- Alerting
 - Users prefer using email
- Inter-Office Document Sharing
 - Consideration should be given to use the GD system to ease the burden of IDS requirements.
 - Should not forget the ultimate goal of achieving the "active component" filing an application from office to office.
 - Consider using a common application filing form, uploading to this form common bibliographic information, relying on first filed application and under PLT achieving "active component."



TOPIC 3 – Updates on GD Priorities

- Applicant Name Standardization
 - Should be considered in the context of global assignment
- General Comments
 - Industry would like to know what can be realized and timelines
 - Patent Offices should reduce or eliminate the use of paper communications, certificates, etc.
