
Japan Intellectual Property Association (JIPA)




[Primary Energy Consumption per GDP]








The number of application: increasing drastically due to globalization


Achievements




242K/year duplicated applications in Trilateral Offices (Year 2006)

Common (Shared) Search Strategies

JPO's trial Patent Prosecution Highway

<u>US</u>

Flot program with USPTO since July 2006.

<u>S Korea</u>

Implementation from April 2007 with KIPO.

<u>UK.</u>

Agreed Pilot program with UKIPO from July 2007.

<u>Germany</u>

Panned in March 2008.

Expectations to Trilateral Cooperation

- Introduction of same format to reduce patent cost as soon as possible
- Realization of exploitation of search/examination results to obtain high and same quality patent at same timing
- Leadership at Harmonization on substantive patent law to realize global patent system
