For the best experience, we recommend using the latest version of Chrome, Firefox, Edge, or Safari. The platform is designed for use on desktop computers and tablets.




3. Navigating the library

The EPO digital library on innovation is designed to facilitate intuitive exploration and quick access to a wide range of resources. Here's how to find your way around:


3.1 Homepage overview

Instantly access the newest resources available.




The carousel displays the pages of the most recently added resources.






3.1.2 Curated collections

Use the search bar to find resources by topic, title, or content in the summary. As you enter text in the search bar, suggestions for relevant resources are dynamically displayed based on your input.






4. Accessing resources


4.1 Viewing and downloading
